

Weekly Web Lessons



In 2017 SDEHS will be scheduling more weekly web lessons using Adobe Connect. Each faculty has nominated at least one course in their faculty for these lessons. Some faculties are already running weekly lessons but the new faculties coming on board intend to start these web lessons in Week 6 (week starting 27/02/17). Each faculty will contact you regarding the exact day and time of the lesson and how students can access each Adobe Connect "classroom".

The aim of this initiative is to support students to participate and engage with their work and establish connections among students and their teachers and fellow students. This method of communication has been used successfully by teachers over the past few years and we intend to expand this experience with more students.

We invite and encourage all students in these courses to attend these lessons. Students will be accredited for engaging in their weekly work if they are able to attend.

Teachers may also ask students to use Adobe Connect for individual web lessons to help them with their work.

Home Student Announcements



Home Student Announcements are short video clips available through the elearning course of the same name. They are updated regularly and are a great way to keep up to date on important school information and upcoming events.

Email from a Former Student

Dear Mrs Hodges,

It's Michelle Lim. I graduated from SDEHS in 2012. I know this email is pretty out of the blue and I'm not sure if you remember me but I have never forgotten you!

I know it's been a while, but since I am about to start my last year of university I've been thinking about how lucky I was to have had the support and encouragement from all of the teachers and staff at SDEHS during my last 2 years of high school. I am so sure that I wouldn't have been able to get through the HSC without it, and I most definitely wouldn't be embarking on my last year of university.

A lot of things have happened over the past 4 years. I am really enjoying my degree at the University of Sydney where I am studying psychology and neuroscience. My first year of university was great, I absolutely loved all of my classes and I was even selected to dance at the Vice-Chancellor's gala in front of hundreds of people.

At the end of 2014 I was lucky enough to be awarded a scholarship to visit and study in Shanghai and Beijing, China. I was there during the winter and it was absolutely beautiful. I learnt so much about the culture, its people and I even climbed The Great Wall of China! I have also been very lucky to have had the opportunity to intern at the Brain and Mind Research Institute (BMRI) and I am proud to say that during my internship I was part of the team which help to create the first online mental health clinic. This clinic is now up and running and has been an amazing tool for those who don't have access to professional psychological help. I have also had the opportunity to intern at the Children's Medical Research Institute, where I was able to conduct research on telomere maintenance and telomere length regulation.

I have been highly involved with all of the societies on campus as well, from the Psychology Society, Mental Health Society to the Science Society. I am currently part of the research and development team of ENACTUS, which is a worldwide student run society that focuses on developing social enterprises to solve current social issues. One of the ENACTUS projects that have been highly successful is Culinary Tales. The program provides culinary training to refugees from all around Sydney, and when completed they're able to run their own cooking classes. Not only does the program enable refugees to connect with their local community through their food and culture but it also provides them with a source of income and sense of belonging in their community.

It feels like a lifetime since I graduated from SDEHS, and I'm sure there have been lots of wonderful things happening at SDEHS too! Thank you again for all of your support, I truly appreciate it. I will never forget how awesome and encouraging all of my SDEHS teachers were and I can't express how much of a positive impact it has had on my life so far!

Computer Buying Guide for Students

Access to a reliable computer is an important part of life as a Distance Education student but when it's time to buy a new device, things can quickly become overwhelming if you're not sure what you will need.

The link includes a guide to suggested devices and lists the specifications and software necessary to enable you to fully participate in your distance education.

The link also includes The Sydney Distance Education High School BYOD Policy which is very important as it clearly states what your responsibilities are as a student any time you bring your device to school.

Name Change UPDATE

For students and their families in Years 10, 11 and 12: please be advised that BOSTES has officially changed its name to the **NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA)**. NESA is responsible for the NSW Curriculum, RoSA and the HSC.

From the start of 2017, Open High School has changed its name to **NSW School of Languages**. The name change now reflects what this school does. A number of our students are enrolled in studies for Years 7–12 with NSW School of Languages.

Disability Provisions 2017 Higher School Certificate

NESA, the NSW Education Standards Authority (formerly BOSTES), offers a range of Disability Provisions to students who may need certain assistance to enable them to successfully complete their Higher School Certificate Examinations.

If you think that your student may need to apply for Disability Provisions for the 2017 Higher School Certificate Examinations, please phone Alicia Gilmore on 9383 0298 and request that the application form be sent to you.

This form, together with relevant supporting documentation, will need to be completed by you and returned to Sydney Distance Education High School. We will then lodge the application with NESA.

The NESA closing date for Disability Provisions applications is Friday 7 April 2017. Your completed forms will need to reach SDEHS by Friday 24 March 2017 to ensure that the NESA deadline is met, except for applications based on chronic fatigue syndrome, post-viral syndrome, Ross River fever or glandular fever, which should be submitted in July of the examination year, with teacher comments and medical documentation, also dated July.

This information is to let you know of the need to apply for Disability Provisions by the end of Term 1, except for students with CFS or the conditions listed above. Any approved provisions can be used for Trial exams and assessment tasks in Year 12.

RoSA Online Literacy and Numeracy Tests

Optional tests in literacy and numeracy are available for students who intend to leave high school before completing their HSC.

The test reports give an overview of a student's level of achievement in literacy and numeracy, focusing on the skills required by school leavers for employment and further education.

During Term 1, these tests will be offered to all home students in Year 11 and 12 at SDEHS. Students at centres who wish to do the online tests should speak to their teachers at the centre about this.

Attention Parent/Carers!

Have your family or child's circumstances changed recently?

Often things change in our lives and we think nothing of it. Below is a summary of changes that we at Sydney Distance Education High School need to know about. This will greatly assist our school in planning to support your child's health and wellbeing.

Health Care Plans

If your child develops a health condition or their current health condition changes, we need to be informed promptly to ensure your child's health and safety.

Medication

If your child's medication changes we need to update this information on your child's Health Care Plans. We also need to know if your child can carry or self-administer their medication while at school or on an excursion.

Anaphylaxis and Allergies

It is very important that we receive updates about allergies as soon as possible so we can update our Health Care Plans immediately. You will need to provide an ASCIA Action Plan for Anaphylaxis completed and signed by a doctor. Also, replace the adrenaline autoinjector in a timely manner before it expires or after it has been used.

Contact Information

If you change address, get a new phone number or change your email address we need to know. Distance Education simply cannot work effectively if we cannot contact you or your child.

Emergency Contact Information

We always like to have someone else we can contact if we can't get hold of you. Has your emergency contact person changed their phone number, address or email address? Please let us know.

Permission to Publish

We love to celebrate the hard work of our students and regularly share experiences of study days, excursions and social days. We need to make sure we are not publishing your child's photo or work if you don't want us to. If you are happy to share your learning and experiences, make sure you have completed the Permission to Publish form which was included in the enrolment pack.

We appreciate your assistance in this regard and assure you that any information you provide the school will be stored securely and will only be used or disclosed in order to support your child's health needs. If you have any questions about any of this information please do not hesitate to contact us.

The Mentoring program

Mentoring at SDEHS is an opportunity for student to develop a connection with a volunteer teacher who will offer support and encouragement on a one-to-one basis.

Mentoring provides a structured and trusting relationship that brings young people together with caring individuals who offer guidance, support and encouragement.

The mentor is not a replacement for a parent nor are they a counsellor or teacher. They are a sounding board and confidant to the young person.

The mentoring partnership is a structured one-to-one

relationship that focuses on the needs of the mentored participant. As such, mentoring may be described as the process of 'walking along beside' someone with the aim of helping that person achieve their potential.

The mentoring partnership is:

- undertaken willingly
- informed
- interactive
- confidential

Effective mentoring seeks to establish a trusting relationship between student and mentor that:

- focuses on the needs of the student
- models and fosters caring and supportive relationships to increase
 - o self-confidence, awareness and management of behavior
 - o positive attitudes towards assisting others

Students who are enrolled as home students and who are in Year 7 to Year 12 are invited to participate in this program.


World Book Online is now available through your Oliver library database.

Message to Parents/Carers

Keep Kids Safe: #parentscheckthecheck!

Parents or carers who engage the services of a private tutor or coach have an important role to play in helping to keep their children safe.

From 1 April 2016 adults who provide private tuition or coaching services to children will need to obtain a new Working With Children Check.

The Certificate for Self Employed People will no longer be valid after its expiry date and certificate holders will need to apply for a new Working With Children Check.

Parents or carers should ask their child's tutor or coach for their name, date of birth and their Working With Children Check number.

They must then go online and verify the tutor or coach is not barred from working with children in NSW. Verifying that a tutor or coach can work with children is quick and easy – just follow the simple steps at www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au/parentscheckthecheck
